I am a Detective Constable in South Wales Police based at Cardiff Airport.

This is a short report in respect of the above case.

I will state that at 7.22pm Wednesday 8th May 2012, Mawie Kiru attended Cardiff Airport foyer wishing to serve a witness summons on a Jaculla CLAYTON % Air Traffic Control, Cardiff Airport.

With DC 4666 Special Branch and myself DC 1570 Special Branch we had a brief conversation with him,

He was asked what he wanted at the airport and explained he wished to serve a summons on Jaculla Clayton.

I asked to view the summons which he handed to me. I then tried to contact Mr Clayton's place of work.

On my return to DC 4333, Kiru had left the airport with leaving the summons unserved.

I would add the address on the summons for CLAYTON is incorrect and he is not an employee of South Wales Police.

In respect of the above proceedings I wish to report as follows:-

On Wednesday 8th May 2013 at 7.22pm Mr. Kirk attended at Cardiff Airport wishing to serve a witness summons upon a Jonathan Clayton (Air Traffic Control).
