

## Statement of Truth 28<sup>th</sup> July 2013

I, Maurice John Kirk, of no fixed abode, confirm that this, my statement, is true to the best of my belief and say as follows:

1. On 19<sup>th</sup> July 2013, at around 7.30pm and after my having called for police to attend, I am sitting quietly on private land in a car only to be violently arrested, handcuffed behind my back and then dragged off to a police cell for the third time in a week
2. It was an hour and a half before the police decided to have me breathalysed
3. The results were concluded at 9.00pm with two zero readings despite the fact, at the time of my arrest, the police had recorded I was drinking from a bottle of red wine.
4. I confirm that, on the same day and during a late lunch in a Penarth restaurant, having just been released from custody, I consumed a whole bottle of white wine purchased there.
5. The wine was consumed during a period commencing at some time after 2pm and in the presence of three other easily traceable witnesses.
6. Why, then, having consumed more than a bottle of wine was there irresponsible delay and a negative result on a definitive test with no roadside breath test having been taken?
7. Why, on three previous but separate occasions, South Wales Police had arrested me on the road side, following three recorded positive breath tests but each police station definitive test, one taken within ten minutes, all in under an hour, had each produced a zero result?
8. This is proven criminal intent by senior police officers to pervert the course of justice.
9. I make this statement for an independent investigation to be ordered as previous complaints to either The Professional Standards Department of the South Wales Police or Independent Police Complaints Authority (IPCC), have all been rubbished in a most perfunctory manner.
10. My complaints include the fabrication of my forensic medical records, deliberate to have me sectioned under the 1983 Mental Health Act to Ashworth High Security Psychiatric Hospital, following Dolmans, solicitors' deliberately drawn up erroneous Chief Constable's 2009 affidavit denying incidents ever occurred and later arranging, in an attempt to fool a jury, the repainting of a Lincolnshire WWI Lewis machine gun from the colour of 'silver' to 'black'.
